## **Strengthening the role of financiers in the Cabinet improve relations Russia and India**

Strengthening the role of financiers in the government of Russia will positively impact on the Russian-Indian cooperation, believes Director Indian Institute of Finance, Professor J. Agarwal.

NEW DELHI, September 25 - RIA Novosti, Yevgeny Bezek. Strengthening the role of financiers in the government of Russia will positively impact on the Russian-Indian cooperation, believes Director Indian Institute of Finance, Professor J. Agarwal.

On Monday, 24 September, has been declared the new government, which Alexei Kudrin retained the post of head of the Russian Ministry of Finance and the Vice-Premier Viktor Zubkov, formerly head of the Federal Service for Financial Monitoring. Chapter MERT appointed Elvira Nabiullina, rukovodivshaya to this expert advice to the Council on the implementation of priority national projects to the President of Russia.

Professor Agarwal described the new Prime Minister of Russia as a "linear, focused and consistent person", a successful manager Rosfinmonitoringa and "pro-free market".

"I think the recent developments, in particular, the appointment of Prime Minister Viktor Zubkov, can benefit from the Russian-Indian relations," said Agarwal, commenting on changes in the economic bloc government of the Russian Federation.

Professor believes that India and Russia have a number of similar problems, such as corruption, money laundering, the financing of terrorist activity.

"Now that the Prime Minister has Zubkov, Russia and India could, taking hands, rid of all these ills Asia," said Agarwal.

In the economic sphere, professor noted as one of the most interesting subjects for cooperation programming.

"India has a very strong position in the field of software, this is one of the potential sectors of cooperation," he said, referring to the potential for increasing India's exports to Russia.

Agarwal also noted potential interaction between the two countries in other sectors, from leather to produce nuclear energy.
